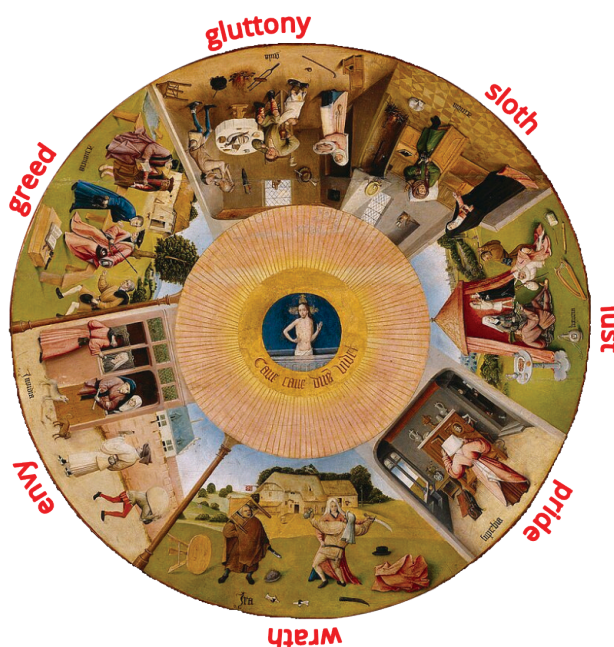

Give an Account of Your Stewardship

In our Gospel reading, Luke 16:1-13, a master called his steward and asked him "to give an account of his stewardship." This is a reminder to all of us to be prepared for God's judgment. We have all been entrusted with our Master's resources.

In Jesus' story, reports got to the steward's master that he was squandering resources. So, what resources is the Gospel asking us about? God's resources are the blessings of God to us, our life, our finances, our time, talents, our families, our work/job or our faith, and our church. In the text, Jesus concluded by telling us that "No servant can serve two masters... You cannot serve God and mammon (wealth). You will either love the one and hate the other, or be devoted to the one and despise the other." (Luke 16:13.)

By the above statement, Jesus does not imply that our lives should be lived devoid of wealth. In the Bible, there is nothing inherently immoral about wealth; in fact wealth is typically associated with blessing. For example,

in Genesis 26:12-15, God blessed Isaac by making him wealthy. Wealth is a tangible expression of God's blessing and should be enjoyed. What Jesus is inviting us to do is to embrace piety using our wealth.

Christians must understand that financial stewardship is a critical and integral part of what it means to be a disciple of Jesus. Some people, like the servant in today's parable, are dishonest with money. They squander it or make it in a dishonest way. But when that servant realized this, he asked himself, "What shall I do now..." Immediately when he came to this realization, he put his talents to good use in helping the master recover his losses. What was entrusted to him was recovered. The master praised him for his shrewdness and for acting prudently. For that he is recommended to us as an example of how to live a life of stewardship.

If we fail to have a firm and biblical grasp of this, we will be in danger of the squandering of resources entrusted to us.

Please contact the office or Bernie G (txt. 306-535-9998) if you can help in any of the following ways (those most needed are in bold):

Altar Co-ordinators* – Prepare altar items before Mass, light candles, help serve Communion, cleanse the sacred vessels, and put things away.

Altar Servers* – Assist Father during Mass.

Children's Liturgy* (Criminal Record Check required) – Prepares a lesson, and teaches the children the meaning of the Gospel, through word, song and art. (Sundays Only)

Communion Ministry* – Serve Communion, either at the front, or back and choirloft.

Church Linens – Launder, press and fold the special linens that are used during the Mass.

Decorating Committee – Changes the décor to reflect the liturgical seasons.

Lectors* – Proclaim the word of God.

Intercessory Leaders* – Read a short welcome message, later General Intercessions, and later announcements.

Sacristan – Brings the bread, wine, oil, and votive candles to church. Keeps the sacristy and sanctuary tidy, and makes sure everything used at Mass is in its place, and in working order.

Seamstress – Provide home-sewn linens that are used during the Mass, and baptismal garments.

Ushers* – Welcome and assist parishioners as they arrive, and help take the Collection. Head ushers (Criminal Record Check required) open the church an hour before Mass and handle the collection.

* Volunteers for Mass come early and sign in. Altar servers and Intercessory leader 15 minutes. Head usher one hour. Other ushers half an hour.
