Dig Deep into the Gospel with Father James.

The Apostles said to the Lord: "Increase our Faith" (Luke 17:5)

The above words from the start of today's Gospel reading (Luke 17:5-10) shows that the apostles struggled in their faith. The Bible is full of stories about people of faith, such as Enoch, Noah, Abraham and Sarah, Jacob, Joseph, Moses, Samuel, David, and so on. They are presented to us as heroes of faith. When we read of their faith in their specific situations, we sometimes wonder if they too struggled, especially in very difficult situations. For that is when it seems hard for one to maintain faith in God.

Jesus' response to the Apostles refers to the potential of any seed. Seeds have potential if they are planted. It will grow into a plant, a tree and then produce fruits. The mention of their 'increase' implies their natural growth. That was why Jesus responded by saying, "If you had faith

the size of a mustard seed, you could say to this mulberry tree, 'Be uprooted and planted in the sea,' and it would obey you" (Luke 17:6). That means, the size of the seed of one's faith does not matter. He illustrates that even the smallest amount of true faith has the potential to produce immense growth, overcome obstacles, and achieve great things.

Jesus is reminding us to tap into the power of faith. But what is faith? The Letter to the Hebrews defines it in this way: "Faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen" (Hebrews 11:1). Through His response, Jesus reminded them and us that faith is not something given to lay dormant, but something that must be grown. Just as seeds must be nourished in good soil and grown, so we too must put our faith into practice in order for us to live our faith.






