Dig Deep into the Gospel with Father James.

"Many will come in My name and say, 'I am He!' and, 'The time is near!' Do not go after them."

Having dealt with the perversion of religion in the Temple of Jerusalem, where worship due to God was corrupted and abused by the likes of the scribes, the Pharisees, and the money changers, Jesus predicted and prophesied that the temple would come to an end, like the prophet Jeremiah did (Jeremiah 7:1-15). He said that everything will be thrown down and no stone will be left upon another. Some of His disciples were shocked that this could befall the temple, which was adorned with such beautiful stones and gifts dedicated to God. Indeed, the Jerusalem temple was an impressive structure to behold. It was one of the seven wonders of the world at the time.

In the eyes of many, if the temple came to an end, that would also mean the end of the world, because of what the temple represented. They couldn't just understand how there could be an end to the holy of holies, the table of the shew bread, the menorah, the temple walls and its grounds. Thus, they asked, when it would be and what signs would there be beforehand.

Jesus clarifies that the end of the Temple will not mean the end of the world will come immediately (21:10-11). He mentions that wars and insurrections will occur, but these cannot be singled out as signs of the End. Accordingly, the destruction of Jerusalem is not the prelude to their deliverance from persecution; rather, it is to be viewed as an act of Divine punishment, for the Son of God came to them, and they did not accept Him.

The demolition of the temple, which occurred in AD 70 (about thirty to forty years after Jesus' ascension), has come to be interpreted as giving way to the reign of Jesus as the New Covenant. He warns that many messiah pretenders will show up, but not to follow them. Next weekend is the feast of Christ the King. Jesus will be enthroned. The Body of Christ, the Eucharist, is the new way to worship God.
