Dig Deep into the Gospel with Father James.

The Lenten Journey is to the Place of the New Testament (Matthew 17:1-9)

On this Second Sunday of Lent, our Gospel text is the transfiguration. Jesus took Peter, John and James up a mountain to pray. There, Elijah and Moses, the protagonists of the Old Testament – the Torah and the Prophets – appeared and were discussing with Jesus. When Peter saw them, he quickly proposed that they build three tents for worship and devotion: one for Moses, one for Elijah, and one for Jesus. Peter thereby unintentionally put Jesus on the same level as Moses and Elijah.

While Peter was still speaking, God's voice from the cloud corrected his mistake. "This is my beloved son, in whom I am well pleased; listen to Him" (Mt 17:5). The order echoes what Moses said before he died, "YHWH will raise up a prophet, and you must listen to him" (Deuteronomy 18:15)

Our Lenten journey is to the place where Jesus will move us from the Laws and the Prophets of old (Moses and

Elijah) and settle us in the place of Grace, the New Testament (Jesus). Moses and Elijah appeared to Jesus in order to hand over the Law and the Prophets, asking Him to fulfil them. In 2 Peter 1:16-18, Peter recounts his experience as an eyewitness to this, to show how and why Jesus is the way to follow. The interruption and the message of the voice from the cloud reconfirm the identity of Jesus stated at His baptism, in Matthew 3:17.

The passage comes directly after Jesus asks His disciples who people say He is. They responded, "John the Baptist," "Elijah," "a prophet." Then Jesus asks them, "But who do you say that I am?" Peter declares that Jesus is the Messiah. Right after this revelation, Jesus tells what will happen next: suffering, rejection, and crucifixion. God identified Jesus as His son by using the words of Psalm 2:7, "You are my son"; Son of God in the messianic sense. God's voice heard from the clouds, tell everyone that He is from heaven. He is true God and true man.

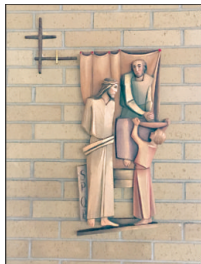
