Dig Deep into the Gospel with Father James.

"Go, wash in the pool of Siloam" (John 9:7).

This Sunday's Gospel's text is about the congenitally blind man whom Jesus sends to wash in the pool of Siloam (John 9:1-41). Jesus "made mud with His saliva," anointed or "spread" the mud on the man's eyes, and then told him, "Go wash in the pool of Siloam" (John 9:6-7).

To "go wash" in the "pool of Siloam" (John 9:6-7) is the purpose of the journey of Lent. The Greek name Siloam comes from a transliteration of the Hebrew word for "sent," "shiloah." Jesus is the one "sent" by the Father. There is a connection being drawn between Jesus and this pool. The intimate connection between the action of washing and the state of being clean points to Jesus as the awaited Messiah, who is the Light of the world and the one sent to provide sight to the blind (cf. Luke 4:18).

The story of the congenitally blind person is clearly connected with baptism. The man has been blind since birth. We are sinners from birth, made out of dirt and inheriting original sin from Adam. Jesus mixes his spittle with dirt and applies it; literally, the Greek text says that He anoints with it (*epi + chrio*). This verb "*chrio*" is the basis for Jesus' title, "Christ," and the words "chrism" and "christening."

We are going to the place where Jesus washes the feet of His disciples at the Last Supper (Jn 13:5-15), and then to the place where water and blood flowed from His side from on top of the cross. From there we will go to the place of the waters of baptism at Easter.


