**Why do Christians celebrate Pentecost?
"He breathed on them and said: Receive the Holy Spirit"**

Even though the feast of Pentecost in scripture was celebrated in the Old Testament, the main reason why we Christians celebrate it is found in the two New Testament texts of today's liturgy - Acts 2:1-11 and John 20:19-23. They detail how and why the Holy Spirit came down upon the believers in two different places on two different days. We may gather from what we read that the Holy Spirit will continue to come down upon believers wherever and whenever He wishes.

We profess our faith in the words of the Nicene Creed, including "We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is adored and glorified." In our Gospel text, on that first Easter Sunday, when Jesus breathed on His apostles, He gave them the Holy

Spirit, and the Apostles got their lives back. And, fifty days later, in Acts 2:1-11, the whole community of believers received the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.

The giving of the Spirit, either as the Divine Breath from Jesus or as it was experienced on that Pentecost Day, connotes the giving of new life, like in Gen 2:7, when God breathed life into Adam, and Ezekiel 37:1-14, when God breathes life into the dry bones. We, too, received the Holy Spirit at Baptism and at Confirmation and through the other sacraments. The Spirit transforms us into a new creation, into members of the Church, and He enables us to fully participate in God's mission. We too become like those apostles that Jesus commissioned, saying: "As the Father has sent me, I am sending you." (John 20:21). Let us adore Him and glorify Him.
