Dig Deep into the Gospel with Father James.

Human Flourishing: Jesus says, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life."

Aristotle defined the purpose of all human effort as the pursuit of "human flourishing" (*eudaemonia*), translated as "happiness" or life well-lived, but humans have always been on the elusive search for the flourishing good life. After Aristotle, Epicurus argued that pleasure is the only final good, and that all other things we pursue are merely means to more pleasure. It was still debated in the time of Jesus.

In John 14, Jesus referred His disciples to heaven and told them they "know the way." Thomas asked Jesus, "Lord, we don't know where You are going, so how can we know the way?" (14:5.) Relatedly, Philip asked, "Lord, show us the Father, and we shall be satisfied" (14:8).

Jesus' response to both of them has been the guiding principle for all Christians till date. In John 14:6, Jesus answered, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No

one comes to the Father except through Me." To Philip Jesus said, "Don't you know me, Philip, even after I have been among you such a long time? Anyone who has seen me has seen the Father." (John 14:6.)

Jesus' presentation of himself ("I AM") as the way, the truth, and the life, is an invitation to understand these three concepts as absolute, and therefore incompatible with relativism or religious/moral pluralism. Looking around the world today, one cannot help but ask, how did we get things so wrong? Contemporary culture has much that is detrimental and inimical to what Jesus taught and showed us about life. Jesus is the teacher with perfect knowledge, and He is the moral compass and divine influence. No disciple can take other ways to God than through the revelation of God himself, Jesus Christ. Jesus is God incarnated, the Messiah. It was He who gave His life as the sacrifice for the forgiveness of sins.
