Jesus Asks Us, the Church, to Pray

In Matthew 9:36-10:8, Jesus, moved by deep compassion for the vulnerable crowds, asked the disciples, His Church, to pray to God for more workers to be sent out into the mission. Jesus saw that "the crowds...were harassed and helpless" (Matthew 9:36). The word for "harassed" in the Greek Biblical lexicon refers to someone weary because of their circumstances, and the word for "helpless" refers to the overwhelming effect of negative circumstances.

"Sheep without a shepherd" will struggle and become defenseless, because they depend on their shepherds for protection, as well as for grazing, watering, shelter, and treatment for their injuries. Like those sheep, very many people in the world today are helpless. They are roaming without direction. Even some Christians have stopped praying, believing that the world is too lost and blind in sin.

Jesus speaks to the needs of the human condition today. The world is full of many people who need spiritual help. These people desperately need laborers who themselves have been spiritually helped to go to meet them, sharing and living the gospel of salvation.

The threefold ministry of Jesus, teaching, proclaiming, and healing, has the parish at its center. Parishes need not only priests and religious, but also ushers, Sunday school teachers, communion ministers, choir members, council members, ministers to the shut-ins, church building maintenance workers, and altar servers. The world needs us to work together.

By saying, "The harvest is plentiful," Jesus is saying there are volumes of broken people ready to be "gathered." Please, consider becoming a worker for God's people. Perhaps ask God for the opportunity, to send you.
