Dig Deep into the Gospel with Father James.

Do not fear those who can kill the body but cannot kill the soul

In Matthew 10, Jesus sends out the twelve to go to the house of Israel. Jesus perceived that the disciples were afraid that they were going to be persecuted and maybe killed by the Jewish authorities, because Jesus had so sharply denounced the Pharisees. In Luke 11:42-52, for example, He described them with several "woes." He would refer to them as white-washed tombs.

Jesus reassured the twelve, saying not to fear "He who can kill the body" (Matthew 10:28). Jesus redirected their attention to the one who has power over body and soul. "The one able to destroy the body and soul in hell" is God. He asked them to fear (reverence) God alone and boldly confess Jesus even before men who might be hostile to them (Matthew 10:32-33). God has ultimate control over everyone's physical life (body) and life after death (soul).

Ever since the time of Jesus, persecution has been a visible consequence of following Jesus. There continue to be deliberate efforts to antagonize and obliterate the ways of the gospel. Jesus foresaw all these things. He warned His disciples that they would be "handed over to councils" (probably small Jewish civic bodies) and "flogged in synagogues" (Matthew 10:17). The apostles were publicly flogged by the Jewish Sanhedrin in Jerusalem for continuing to preach in the name of Jesus (Acts 5:40-42). Stephen was stoned to death in Acts 7:57-60. Paul endured flogging in 2 Corinthians 11:25. James, son of Zebedee, was executed by Herod (Acts 12:2; cf. Mark 10:33-45).

The Apostles heeded Jesus' words. Instead of being intimidated, they continued to teach every day both at the temple and in homes and in public. They and their successors spread the gospel until it reached us.

The Archbishop's Appeal this year asks us to contribute further to the Healing Response to the Truth and Reconciliation Commission (TRC) findings.

From the Archdiocese Office, Ecumenism Commission:

The Anglican-Roman Catholic Dialogue of Canada has issued a report on their three-year study of apology through the lenses of scripture, theology, and history.

In recent years several churches have offered formal apologies to individuals and communities of people who have been harmed – sometimes traumatically – by our words and deeds. Do such apologies make any difference? What makes an apology genuine? Why apologize in the first place? These are some of the questions we've heard people inside and outside of our churches ask, and they're among the questions we've asked ourselves in preparing this latest work of the Anglican-Roman Catholic Dialogue of Canada, which also includes Lutheran and Eastern Catholic participation.
