The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ - The New Covenant

In the Old Covenant, the people of Israel kept in mind how, for forty years, the Lord God provided manna and directed their journey. Today's first reading (Deuteronomy 8:2-16) refers to it repeatedly. The manna gave them the strength to endure great difficulties through the "vast and terrible wilderness, enduring the bites and stings of serpents and scorpions, with the hardship of the parched and waterless grounds" (Deuteronomy 2:15-16).

In John 6, Jesus explains that those who ate manna died because manna could not give everlasting life like the food that God gives in Jesus can (John 6:53). Jesus explains that He came from heaven to give Himself to everyone in this Bread, to make us able to pursue our journey toward Heaven, toward eternity. "Whoever eats this bread will live forever" (John 6:58). It has this effect

because Jesus will surrender Himself on the cross, and we, following His example, surrender our lives in trust to the will of God.

On this Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (historically known as Corpus Christi), we are invited to enter deeply into this sacrament and celebrate the Real Presence of Jesus Christ — His Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity — in the Eucharistic forms of bread and wine after consecration. In this way Jesus inaugurated the New Covenant at the Last Supper. This replaces the Sinai Covenant, where an animal was used as the sacrifice. Jesus is the Mediator and the sacrifice for the sins of the world.
