Dig Deep into the Gospel with Father James.

Is Jesus really the Promised Messiah?

Matthew 1:1-17, the first verses of the New Testament, introduce Jesus as the Messiah and the direct fulfillment of history's greatest promises to Biblical generations from Adam, Abraham, David, and Jacob. Jesus came at a time when the people were torn between the Jewish concepts of biblical history enunciated in the Old Testament and Hellenism, and the philosophical positions that rubbed off on the returnees from exile in Babylon. This led to widespread syncretism, a mixture of Hellenistic philosophy and Judaism.

The whole of Matthew's Gospel reveals that Jesus is the Christ, the promised one of Genesis 3:15. Leading up to the point of today's Gospel, Matthew 11:25-30, it narrates how the angel of the Lord appeared and spoke about His coming (1:20-23; 2:13, 22); a star guided the wise men to Him (2:2, 9-10); John the Baptist proclaimed His presence (3:1-12); the Spirit of God descended on

Him at His baptism while a voice from heaven declared Him as the one (3:16-17), and in the wilderness temptation, Satan failed to obscure the truth about who Jesus was and what He came to do.

Despite all these revelations and attestations, many people still refused to believe. In today's Gospel, Jesus praises the Father for hiding (in Greek, *krypto*) "these things" from the "wise and intelligent" and revealing (*apokalypto*) them to childlike people. He adds, "Yes, Father, for such was Your gracious will" (11:26). He concludes by saying that all true and personal knowledge of God is mediated by Jesus. He has been given "all things" by the Father, including the authority to make the Father known as the Father and the Son choose. Jesus then offers an invitation to the weary, those searching and who want to know God, "Come,... learn from Me" (vv. 28-29).
